The Samsung scholarship awards up to \$20,000 for undergraduate studies (e.g., room and board, tuition and books), and each applicant is selected according to his or her involvement in school and community activities, academic record and financial need.

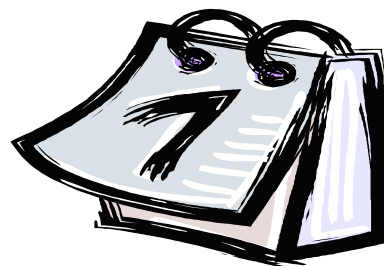
DD214 Requirement

In previous meetings and newsletters we notified everyone of the DD214 requirement for membership. For continued guidance, info on obtaining your DD214 is reprinted here. For any assistance with the process for obtaining your DD214, please contact the Post and we will be more than happy to assist you.

In order to comply with Internal Revenue Service Guidelines, Post 1288 is required to have a copy of our members DD214 on file. In 2014, members without a DD214 on file **will not** be allowed to participate in meetings. Obtaining your DD214 is easy. Veterans can obtain military records using Standard Form 180 (SF-180). Online order forms may also be obtained at vetrecs.archives.gov. Once the form is downloaded and completed identify the correct location of the record you need (based on branch of service, date of separation, and type of record). Send the completed form to the address provided on the form. If you are not able to obtain a SF-180, you may still submit a request for military records by submitting a written request. The written request should include: veteran's name; service number or SSN; branch of service; dates of service; birth date.

A: A copy of the interview can be given to you and with your permission another can be given to the American Legion.
